Commemorative Brick Courtyard

A Memorial Courtyard has always been a part of the vision when in 2018, Clear Path for Veterans New England purchased the Historic 21,000 square foot former Army Headquarters building at 84 Antietam Street in Devens, MA. Our vision was to create a beautiful and serene outdoor gathering place for Veterans, military members, families, and community members to celebrate, recognize, remember, and honor the lives of those who are serving or have served in the United States Military.

The first brick was purchased on February 1, 2021. There are currently 3 benches engraved, 268 bricks, and 19 pavers installed with several waiting to be engraved for the Spring installation. A dedication ceremony was held on May 26, 2022, with over 200 people in attendance.



Organization Structure



Housing & Family Support

December 2024 saw the creation of the Housing and Family Support Division. It is currently comprised of a Director, (2) Program Managers, (2) Program Coordinators, (12) Case Managers and (5) Peer Specialists. This new effort aligned Federal (SSVF), and State (EOVS and HOPE) funded grants under a central program to more efficiently achieve our goal to end chronic homelessness among veterans in our communities. Achieving that goal is complex and requires a holistic approach that addresses the multi-layered challenges many veterans face. The Housing and

Family Support Division provides a full range of support services including but not limited to housing assistance, emergency financial assistance, food insecurity assistance, employment and training resources, VA benefits counseling and navigation, jail diversion programs, services related to PTSD counseling, substance use/misuse disorder counseling and referrals. Intensive case management and

peer counseling are provided to help veterans regain control of their lives. In addition to these services are extensive outreach engagements which strengthen partnerships with other veteran organizations and community organizations.

Those strong community partnerships proved valuable as Clear Path established a satellite office in Manchester, New Hampshire. The Clear Path leadership recognized the lack of veteran services in that region and established a strong foundation by placing a team of experienced veteran case managers to provide services in New Hampshire.

The geographic expansion of Clear Path was furthered by the addition of the Housing Outreach and Placement Efforts (HOPE) grant. Not only did the addition of this grant expand our coverage areas in the state, it also allowed our team to provide services to members of the National Guard and Reserve components.

Integrated Wellness

Clear Path wellness is positioned to make a significant impact in 2025. The Wellness Program is a comprehensive, holistic program that will seek to improve the overall wellness of the veteran. The program has two pipelines, one that will evaluate the wellness of the veteran and develop success strategies with available resources, and the other, which will stress a tracked, measurable success strategy that involves a physical fitness component.

At the heart of the wellness program is the concept of Neuroplasticity- the mind's ability to create, build, or repair neural pathways and networks. Our population has had networks and

pathways created that have been impacted by TBI/PTSD/ MST, depression and anxiety. By using both specific and general treatments, the intent is to create new pathways that allow for higher quality of life and symptom mitigation.

The program consists of two key pipelines: one focused on assessing a Veteran's wellness and developing personalized success strategies using available resources, and the other dedicated to implementing

a measurable, results-driven approach that includes a physical fitness component. Complicated actions that require the mind and body increase the body's drive to create new networks. New networks will increase the brain's ability to function despite the negative impacts of TBI, trauma, or cognitive decline associated with aging. The strength of the program will be where conditions and countermeasures overlap and complement one another.

The wellness plan will:

- Define the components of wellness, scope of work, and path forward
- Contextualize them within the relationship between Clear Path and its veterans
- Explore opportunities and avenues to create a rewarding comprehensive wellness program
- Explore the channels and implementation of strategies to become the foundation for Comprehensive Wellness at Clear Path.
- Connect with other programs within the CP4VNE sphere of influence.





Housing Initiatives



Through strategic partnerships and funding, we are developing and managing housing programs to address veteran homelessness and promote long-term stability.

Housing Project

Bates Street

- Units:** 10 three-bedroom rental units
- Projected Revenue:** \$312,000/year (excluding expenses)
- Narrative:** This project supports 8 families with permanent housing. At-risk and homeless Veterans with children have greatly benefited from these units. The remaining 2 units are utilized for individual veterans looking to live together. One of the 10 units is designated for a live-in Residential Manager.



Additional Housing Developments

- 22 Units in Wilmington (Princeton Properties & Chelmsford Housing Authority)
- 12 Units in Norwood
- 30 Units in Waltham (Caritas Communities Partnership)



2025 Housing Initiatives

99 Church Street Leominster, MA

- Project:** Adaptive reuse of a 22,000-square-foot building
- Capacity:** 33 veterans
- Units:** 22 Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) units, emergency beds, and transitional housing
- 20 Emergency Beds** for Homeless Veterans
- Rent:** Approx. \$1,600/month for PSH units
- Projected Revenue:** \$422,400/year before expenses





CP4VNE Service Dog Program



The Clear Path for Veterans Service Dog Program supports Veterans by providing dogs that assist with healing and daily life under the umbrella of The Wounded Warrior Service Dog Program. Our program encourages Veterans to engage socially and find purpose by working with dogs, which helps prevent isolation and supports their healing. Annually, our program receives partial funding through

the Henry Jackson Foundation Wounded Warrior Service Dog Program Grant.

Service dogs benefit not only the Veteran but their family as well, improving family time and work productivity. These dogs help Veterans manage symptoms, such as anxiety, depression, and sleep issues, allowing them to remain employed and productive. They also enable Veterans to participate in activities they might otherwise avoid due to discomfort. Training these dogs does not come without its own set of challenges; as the total cost to raise, train and take a dog through our program

costs \$30,000 and can take 12-18 months. However, working with service dogs fosters a sense of community among Veterans, allowing them to connect with others who understand their experiences. This peer support also leads to new friendships. Veterans learn valuable skills while training service dogs, such as relaxation, time management, and improving communication, which enables them to better handle daily life situations. The program also focuses on public access training, preparing Veterans to navigate various environments with their dogs. Finally, task work is tailored to each Veteran, with dogs trained to recognize signs of distress and provide comfort or wake them from nightmares.


